HOHS participated in the *100 Days of School* event for Harrington School's kindergarten class. The young students "attended" a masquerade ball – a typical event held in the HOH 100 years ago, toured the 118-year-old building, and counted a hundred bricks on the outside wall. HOHS also hosted a treat table that was much visited on the day of the Harrington's Halloween event.

The 10th annual Harrington Car Show in May, put on by Jill Barth of the Studebaker Garage, was a huge draw with over a hundred cars on display. HOHS hosted a beautiful quilt show put on by the Quilting Bee from Spokane. The Chamber of Commerce's



Vintage Country Fair was held the following month and offered a quilt show featuring local quilters.

In September the Harrington Fall Festival, sponsored by the Lions Club, was held. Many Harrington school alumni toured the HOH, regaling members and visitors alike with long time memories as to how the Harrington Opera House was part of their younger

years. Hometown Christmas rounded out the year, with the return of *Photos with Santa* in the HOH lobby. This has been a traditional event for several generations of families, this year being one of the largest turnouts.

The Bank Block building, home of the Harrington Opera House, will be 119 years old in 2023. Needed projects

abound! To maintain and continue the restoration and rehabilitation of the buildings can be a daunting task, especially as we are facing a shortage of available

contractors! Where possible, HOHS seeks to hire locally for each task. In 2023, we estimate \$40,000.00 will be spent on the building.

The big projects planned for this year include wrapping the upper floor window mill work

with aluminum (Diamond Construction), stabilizing the southern cracked brick wall, repair the top of the western wall, and revitalizing the Willis St entrances to the Art and Rummage rooms.

HOHS MISSION STATEMENT

The Harrington Opera House Society is a non-profit 501(c)(3) organization dedicated to the rehabilitation and preservation of the Harrington Opera House for the purpose of providing and promoting cultural opportunities which will enhance community and economic development, and which will also promote the cultural heritage of Harrington and the surrounding areas.



We have an electrician who has volunteered to rewire and add lights and wall plugs in the rummage area. Another worker is busy in the Art Room restroom, moving walls and revising the space. A modern fireproof

vault door, styled similarly to the original, is on

order and a brick mason has been found to work on the surround and some re-plastering will be involved. This vault is in the lobby which was once the Bank of Harrington and later the Harrington State Bank. The vault will return to use for storing articles of value; donated quilts, hand crafts, and files in a fireproof space.

Doors to the new basement stairs need to be sanded, stained, and hung. These and several other tasks, including sheetrock projects, await completion. If you know of available construction workers, or you yourself,

would like to help with small projects, please let us know.

A total of 7 rummage fundraisers were held this year. Generous donations of household items enabled extra events. The vintage room continued to draw many donated treasures and very interested shoppers. The monies raised are slated to go toward building projects in 2023.

The rummage fundraisers included a new feature this year, stand-alone books-for-donation events. A new member offered to become the "book lady." Patrons were treated to books grouped by author, genre and age groups, a step up from rummaging through boxes of books.

We are always accepting donations of items and are so blessed by the generosity of all our donors. Please give us a call (Carol at 509-253-4748) if you have items to donate.

While the rummage events have become a vital source of revenue, funds are also generated by good will donations, membership dues, memorials/ plaques, and tours.

HOHS could not survive if it were not for our many supporters. HOHS sincerely thanks each and every one of our benefactors for their most gracious donations. We pledge to be good stewards of your gifts and use them to preserve and maintain the historic jewel in our midst, The Harrington Opera House.

Dear Members and Supporters,

The Harrington Opera House has a beautiful performing arts venue, a music room for classes, historic tours, a place to hold fundraising events and the home of the Opera House Museum. There is much more we could do, however we are outgrowing the physical space of the Bank Block Building.

The Harrington Opera House Society has been offered the opportunity to purchase the two historic buildings directly east of the Harrington Opera House on 3rd St. The vision for these buildings is a Museum and Art Center, furthering the goals of our mission statement to promote, provide, and preserve the heritage and culture of Harrington and surrounding areas.

The Museum would be a home for all things pertaining to the history, life and times of Harrington. Vintage farming machinery could be displayed on the lot on Willis St. The Art Center would be a place to hold wide varieties of art and home economic classes, workshops and space for individual and community art projects.

The addition of two more buildings to the national historic register will strengthen Harrington's Historic District, while two more open doors on 3rd street will enhance both community and economic development.

Thirty years ago a vision to save the Bank Block Building resulted in what the Harrington Opera House has grown to be today. Now, all these years later is another such opportunity. Do we dare still dream?
