2023 Accomplishments and 2024 Plans

President's Letter

This past year, 2023, was a busy, busy, busy, productive and exciting year! In addition to events, fundraisers, and building rehabilitation projects, the Harrington Opera House Society (HOHS) purchased the PMGLLC building across the street from the Opera House. We are grateful for your support and our grant funders to make these projects possible.



D.R. Integrity completed several projects including repairing and painting the Willis St. exterior woodwork and new picture molding and stage front

and stair repairs in the auditorium.

Talisman Construction Services completed Stage 1 of the south wall stabilization by anchoring the brick wall to the floor joists of the auditorium. This project is funded by Innovia Foundation's Community grant and an Arts Fund's Community Accelerator Grant. Stage 2, the outside repair, will take place early in the spring of 2024.

Kysar Plumbing repaired the AC heat pump unit just in time to cool the auditorium for the June quilt show.

A new lobby bank vault door was purchased and delivered. We are looking for a mason to prepare the opening of the vault and re-plaster the brick wall.

Events:

Two performers began our event season in March. Cellist, Dr. Kevin Hekmatpanah, returned along with pianist, Yoon-Wha Ro, performing classical music. The program in the natural acoustics of the auditorium provided an afternoon of refined music enjoyment.



A full house welcomed the return of JavDean Ludiker and her fiddle orchestra, Group Therapy. Over 20 fiddlers and several other instrumentalists created toe-tapping music reminiscent of the old-time square dances held long ago in the historic Opera House auditorium.

New to our Opera House stage, classical guitarist, Dr. Paul Grove, presented an amazing program exploring music from many different cultural traditions from around the world. His incredible ability to create the sound of so many different types of instruments using only his guitar was transforming. He also featured his transcription of "Green Fields and Meadows" by the Harrington born composer, George Frederick McKay (1899-1970.) Quoted in part from a review by Jeri' Kanally: "When Dr. Grove was all finished playing, he stood smiling and thanked us. But then, in an almost sad and serious tone, he said, 'The world needs more music.' He paused, glanced down and then looked around at his audience and said; 'Especially now.' We all understood. Thank you for uniting our world with your amazing performance!' '

Also new to our stage, singer-song writer, Mel Dalton, was a huge hit with an enthusiastic audience. Quoted in part from another excellent review by Jeri' Kanally:

"The Harrington Opera House audience was caught up and whisked away by Mel Dalton's 'Adventurous Americana' story time! What a fantastic trip it was! Mel is a very talented singer-



songwriter from Coeur d'Alene, Idaho. Her guitar and singing performance touched all of our senses. She sang stories that had very vivid, picturesque themes. The rich tones and textures of Mel's voice and her emotionally interpretive singing style carried us along as we traveled with her."

We were so pleased at the return of the Harrington school's music class in June for a concert. Young folks will continue the legacy of the HOHS. We invite families and teachers to bring youth to performances. You bring us hope for the future.

Two quilt shows presented visitors with breathtaking scenes awash with colors, mesmerizing designs and awe inspiring handcrafting. A very special treat this year was an exhibit during Harrington's Car Show in May of Lonnie LaRae Zundel's collection of exquisite quilts, wall hangings and other handwork creations. Her use of the old time quilting stab stitch method invited close up inspection of her incredible perfection. A second dazzling show during the Vintage Country Fair in June featured quilts by local quilters. We extend an invitation to area quilters to consider taking part in our 2024 Quilt Shows.

The Chamber of Commerce Halloween event brought a large assortment of goblins, princesses, cosplay characters, and many other interesting visitors. Photos with Santa in the beautifully decorated lobby during Harrington's Home Town Christmas completed our events season.

Our Marketing & Advertising Committee featured HOHS events on our website, social media, and a variety of online & print calendars including The Inlander, radio & TV Stations. Promotions were also provided to the Lincoln Advertiser, Harrington Chamber's Newsletter, Lincoln County Record Times and elsewhere. Posters, fliers, event programs, & the Annual Newsletter are also skillfully created in house.

Plans for 2024

The Historic Bank Block Building is 120 years old this year! The building was completed in December 1904. Keep a lookout for celebration plans later this year.

Auditorium Upgrade

A project to consider possible options to upgrade the auditorium's existing stage lights, sound system, and curtains began this year.



Consultants were engaged to appraise the current systems and offer suggestions and cost estimates for new items, installations and training where needed.

The purpose of this project is to explore improvements that might give a better experience for performers and the audience. Audiences and performers in 2024 will be polled to give their input as to their experiences and suggested changes to help HOHS focus on the priorities.

Enhancing the natural acoustics and maintaining the historic aesthetics of the auditorium will be paramount in considering all suggested changes or additions.

The time frame for this project is expected to be a 3-5 year span, depending on needs and funding.
